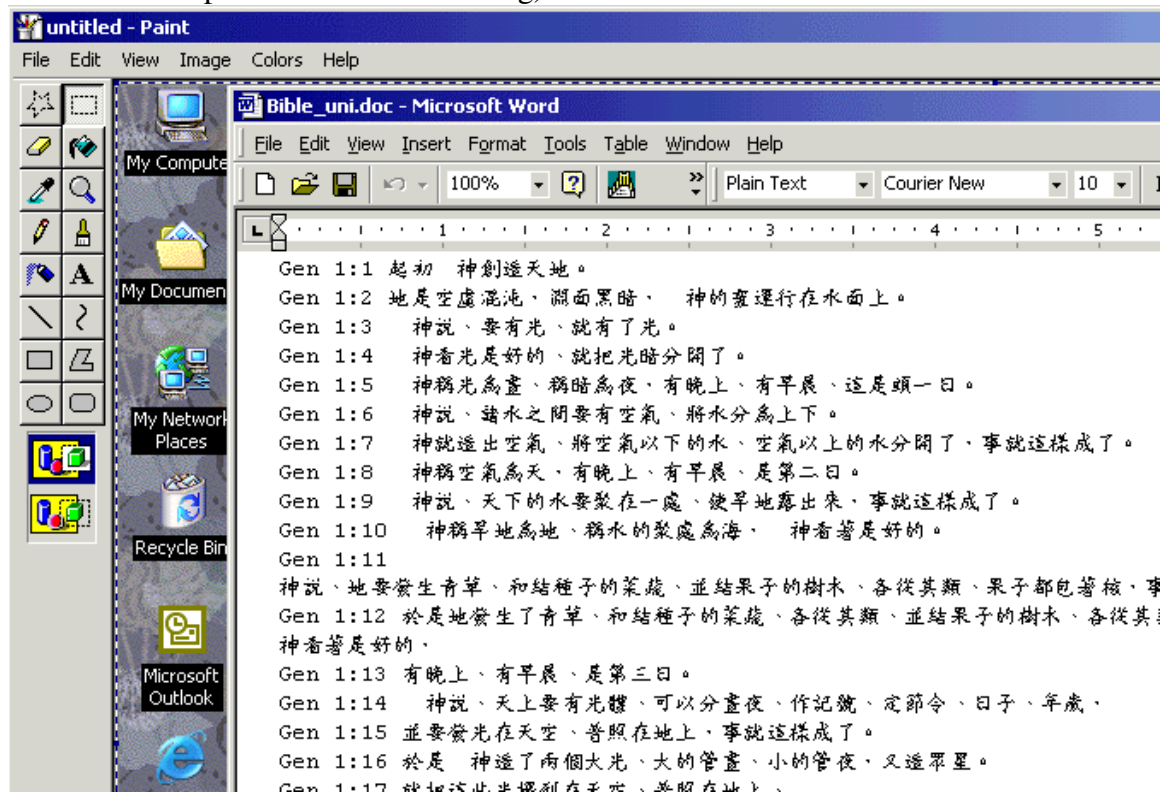


## How to generate a Chinese text as a graph so it can be passed along without any Chinese software installed to read?

Here we introduce two alternatives: (1) Generating Chinese text as gif or jpg format, (2) Generating Chinese text as pdf format.

### (1) Generating Chinese text as gif or jpg format

- Create or open your Chinese text as normal, and expand the screen to full screen, if needed
- Press “Print Scrn” button (located at the up right corner of keypad)
- Open any graph tool or simply open Microsoft “Paint” utility (program files→ accessory→ Paint),
- Choose Edit→ Paste to paste the graph and then save as gif file (don’t save as bmp format since it’s too big)



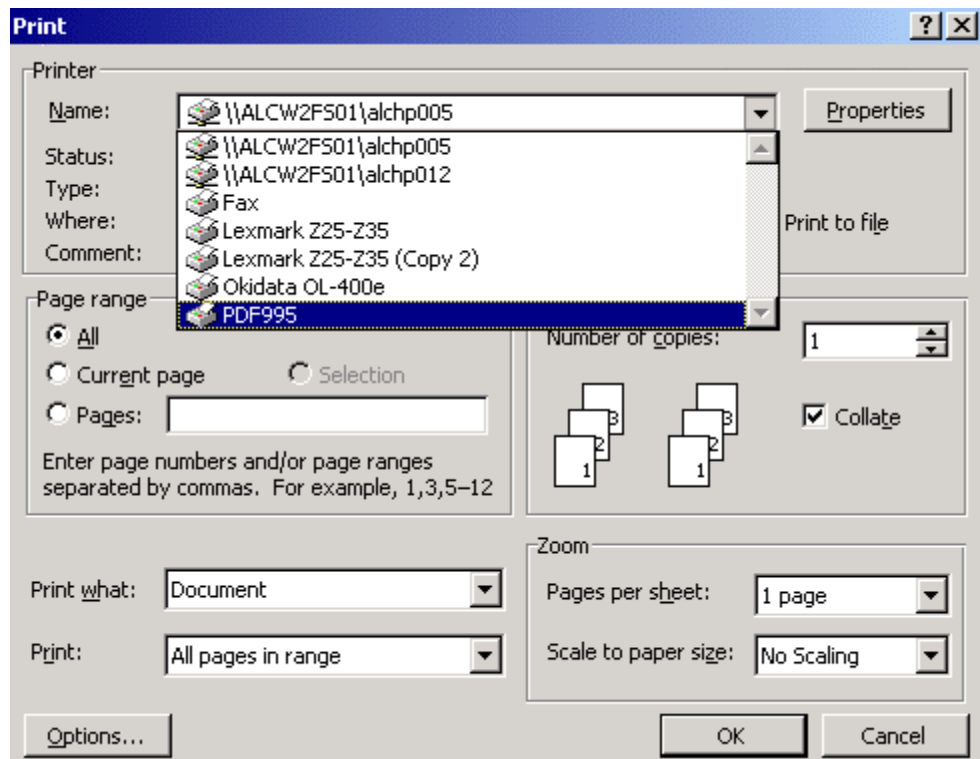
- Except using screen dump as described above, it is better recommended to use a famous shareware “Snagit” to do the screen dump.



- Snagit can let you do multi-screen or regional screen cut which will be very convenient for you. Go to [www.acccn.org](http://www.acccn.org) to find their link to download or you can go to [www.download.com](http://www.download.com) and enter snagit as keyword to download it.

## (2) Generating Chinese text as pdf format

- Download the pdf995 from [www.pdf995.com](http://www.pdf995.com) and install it
- Follow the instruction to install and use it to generate the pdf file by “print” your Chinese document (the pdf generate process is under print function since pdf writer is a printing driver).



- Remember so far It looks like this pdf writer only support PmingLu unicode which probably is the most popular Chinese font anyway.
